<accountability>





<voting>




Participants can vote on **proposals** by endorsing

<sortition>



Use random selection with **proposals** to create groups of people or choose ideas so that there isn't unfair bias.

Sortition is like a lottery, but instead of picking a winner randomly, it's used to choose proposals at random (for example: a person can be a proposal or ideas can be a proposal). When you do sortition with people it ensures that everyone has an equal chance to be involved.

<participatory budget>



You can publish a budget and allow participants to decide how to spend the funds through voting and submitting **proposals**.

A participatory budget is a way for people to help decide how money should be spent on community projects. Instead of just a few people deciding, everyone can pitch in ideas and vote on which projects they think are the most important or fun to fund.
